In 2015, an artist's rendition of New England Patriots' football star Tom Brady at the #Deflategate proceedings—which followed allegations that Brady's team had cheated by using under-inflated balls—was pilloried as unflattering

and unrecognizable. The illustration swiftly went viral. Its artist was heavily criticized as parodies and memes erupted, ridiculing her artwork. The effect of the COVID-19 pandemic on the courts has been significant. Courtroom artists faced a whole new challenge, people's faces behind masks, behind barriers or on video. Limited seating in courtrooms due to social distancing. At the Britney Spears conservatorship, hearing some lawyers made their arguments via video, while others were in court wearing masks.
