We read thus in verse 3 of sura 3: It is He Who sent down to thee (step by step), in truth, the Book, confirming what went before it; and He sent down the Law (of Moses) and the Gospel (of Jesus) before this, as a guide to mankind. However, Islam considers that, with the exception of the Quran, all the holy Books have been falsified by man.
