HOWEVER, THE ATTACK TRANSCENDS MERE PERSONAL RIVALRY. SHADWELL REPRESENTED A BROADER TREND IN RESTORATION THEATRE – A TREND DRYDEN FELT WAS UNDERMINING THE STANDARDS OF POETIC EXCELLENCE. BY SATIRIZING SHADWELL, DRYDEN IMPLICITLY DEFENDED HIS OWN POETIC IDEALS AND ATTACKED THE VERY FOUNDATIONS OF WHAT HE PERCEIVED AS DECLINING ARTISTIC STANDARDS. THE POEM'S POWER LIES NOT ONLY IN ITS WIT BUT ALSO IN ITS POSITIONING WITHIN THE POLITICAL AND LITERARY LANDSCAPE OF THE TIME. DRYDEN EXPERTLY USES THE POLITICAL CLIMATE TO AMPLIFY THE SATIRE, EXPLOITING EXISTING TENSIONS AND PREJUDICES TO ENSURE THE POEM'S IMPACT.

THIS JUXTAPOSITION UNDERSCORES THE POEM'S SATIRICAL BITE, MAKING THE MOCKERY ALL THE MORE EFFECTIVE.

More seriously and for Shadwell's audience more comically, his obsession with his

His character established thereafter the theatrical type of the know-it-all blowhard. Famous for its wit and high-speed changes, *The Virtuoso* is also a display of the prestige of modern science and the pomposity of its amateurs.
