2. KEY CONCEPTS IN PHONOLOGICAL ANALYSIS:

PHONEME: THE SMALLEST UNIT OF SOUND THAT DISTINGUISHES MEANING. FOR EXAMPLE, THE /P/ IN "PIN" AND THE /B/ IN "BIN" ARE DISTINCT PHONEMES BECAUSE CHANGING ONE CHANGES THE MEANING OF THE WORD. PHONEMES ARE ABSTRACT REPRESENTATIONS, WHILE THEIR CONCRETE REALIZATIONS IN SPEECH ARE CALLED ALLOPHONES.

ALLOPHONE: VARIATIONS OF A PHONEME THAT DON'T CHANGE THE MEANING OF A WORD. FOR EXAMPLE, THE ASPIRATED /P/ IN "PIN" (WITH A PUFF OF AIR) AND THE UNASPIRATED /p/ IN "SPIN" (WITHOUT A PUFF OF AIR) ARE ALLOPHONES OF THE SAME PHONEME /P/.

SYLLABLE STRUCTURE: SYLLABLES ARE THE BUILDING BLOCKS OF WORDS, TYPICALLY CONSISTING OF AN ONSET (CONSONANT(S) BEFORE THE VOWEL), A NUCLEUS (VOWEL), AND A CODA (CONSONANT(S) AFTER THE VOWEL). ANALYZING SYLLABLE STRUCTURE REVEALS PATTERNS AND CONSTRAINTS IN HOW SOUNDS COMBINE WITHIN SYLLABLES.

PHONOTACTICS: THESE ARE THE RULES THAT GOVERN WHICH SOUNDS CAN OCCUR IN WHICH POSITIONS WITHIN A SYLLABLE OR WORD IN A GIVEN LANGUAGE. FOR INSTANCE, ENGLISH DOESN'T ALLOW WORDS TO BEGIN WITH CONSONANT CLUSTERS LIKE "NG" (AS IN "NGRAM" WHICH IS AN EXCEPTION) WHILE OTHER LANGUAGES DO.

PHONOLOGICAL PROCESSES: THESE ARE SYSTEMATIC SOUND CHANGES THAT OCCUR IN SPEECH. EXAMPLES INCLUDE ASSIMILATION (SOUNDS BECOMING MORE SIMILAR TO NEIGHBORING SOUNDS, E.G., "TEN BUCKS" BECOMING "TEM BUCKS"), DELETION (SOUNDS BEING OMITTED, E.G., "HANDBAG" BECOMING "HAMBAG"), AND METATHESIS (SOUNDS SWITCHING PLACES, E.G., "ASK" BECOMING "AKS").

3. METHODS OF PHONOLOGICAL ANALYSIS:

PHONOLOGICAL ANALYSIS EMPLOYS VARIOUS METHODS, INCLUDING:

MINIMAL PAIR ANALYSIS: THIS INVOLVES COMPARING WORDS THAT DIFFER BY ONLY ONE SOUND TO IDENTIFY PHONEMES. FOR EXAMPLE, "CAT" AND "HAT" FORM A MINIMAL PAIR, DEMONSTRATING THAT /k/ AND /h/ ARE DISTINCT PHONEMES IN ENGLISH.

TRANSCRIPTION: ACCURATE REPRESENTATION OF SPEECH SOUNDS USING THE INTERNATIONAL PHONETIC ALPHABET (IPA) IS CRUCIAL FOR PHONOLOGICAL ANALYSIS. THIS ALLOWS FOR PRECISE RECORDING AND ANALYSIS OF SPEECH DATA.
