**PHYSICAL EXAMINATION:** THIS INCLUDES A CAREFUL ASSESSMENT OF YOUR DOG'S COAT, SKIN, EYES, EARS, TEETH, AND HEART AND LUNG FUNCTION. THE VET WILL CHECK FOR ANY LUMPS, BUMPS, OR SIGNS OF ARTHRITIS OR OTHER AGE-RELATED CONDITIONS.

**BLOODWORK:** THIS IS OFTEN A CRUCIAL PART OF A SENIOR WELLNESS EXAM. BLOOD TESTS CAN DETECT EARLY SIGNS OF KIDNEY DISEASE, LIVER PROBLEMS, DIABETES, AND OTHER AGE-RELATED ILLNESSES. THE SPECIFIC TESTS RECOMMENDED WILL DEPEND ON YOUR DOG'S BREED, HISTORY, AND ANY OBSERVED SYMPTOMS.

**URINALYSIS:** SIMILAR TO BLOODWORK, A URINALYSIS HELPS ASSESS KIDNEY FUNCTION AND DETECT URINARY TRACT INFECTIONS OR OTHER URINARY ISSUES COMMON IN OLDER DOGS.

**DENTAL EXAMINATION:** SENIOR DOGS OFTEN DEVELOP DENTAL PROBLEMS LIKE PERIODONTAL DISEASE. A THOROUGH DENTAL EXAM IS ESSENTIAL TO IDENTIFY AND ADDRESS POTENTIAL ISSUES.

**WEIGHT MANAGEMENT DISCUSSION:** MAINTAINING A HEALTHY WEIGHT IS ESPECIALLY CRITICAL FOR SENIOR DOGS TO PREVENT FURTHER STRAIN ON JOINTS AND ORGANS. YOUR VET WILL DISCUSS APPROPRIATE DIET AND EXERCISE RECOMMENDATIONS.

**GERIATRIC CONSULTATION:** YOUR VETERINARIAN WILL DISCUSS AGE-APPROPRIATE LIFESTYLE CHANGES AND ANY NECESSARY ADJUSTMENTS TO YOUR DOG'S ROUTINE TO SUPPORT THEIR WELLBEING.

### FACTORS AFFECTING THE COST OF A SENIOR DOG WELLNESS EXAM:

THE COST OF A SENIOR DOG WELLNESS EXAM CAN VARY CONSIDERABLY BASED ON SEVERAL FACTORS:

**ADDITIONAL SERVICES:** IF YOUR DOG REQUIRES ADDITIONAL SERVICES DURING THE EXAM, SUCH AS X-RAYS, ULTRASOUNDS, OR DENTAL CLEANINGS, THIS WILL SIGNIFICANTLY INCREASE THE OVERALL COST.

**BREED AND SIZE:** LARGER BREEDS MAY REQUIRE MORE EXTENSIVE TESTING OR TREATMENT DUE TO THEIR GREATER PREDISPOSITION TO CERTAIN HEALTH ISSUES.

### AVERAGE COST RANGE OF A SENIOR DOG WELLNESS EXAM:

WHILE PROVIDING AN EXACT FIGURE IS IMPOSSIBLE DUE TO THE VARYING FACTORS MENTIONED ABOVE, A REASONABLE ESTIMATE

FOR A BASIC SENIOR DOG WELLNESS EXAM (INCLUDING A PHYSICAL EXAM AND BASIC BLOODWORK) CAN RANGE FROM \$150 TO \$500. HOWEVER, THIS COST CAN EASILY CLIMB TO \$700 OR MORE IF EXTENSIVE TESTING, X-RAYS, OR OTHER SPECIALIZED PROCEDURES ARE NECESSARY.
