DEMONSTRATING KNOWLEDGE OF THE HAZARD

TO SUCCESSFULLY SUE, YOU MUST DEMONSTRATE THAT THE BUSINESS KNEW, OR SHOULD HAVE REASONABLY KNOWN, ABOUT THE POTHOLE'S EXISTENCE AND FAILED TO TAKE APPROPRIATE ACTION TO RECTIFY THE HAZARDOUS CONDITION. THIS MIGHT INVOLVE SHOWING EVIDENCE OF PREVIOUS COMPLAINTS, REPORTS, OR EVEN THE OBVIOUS NATURE OF THE POTHOLE'S SIZE AND

CONDITION.

PROVING FAILURE TO ACT REASONABLY

SIMPLY KNOWING ABOUT A POT HOLE ISN'T ENOUGH. YOU MUST SHOW THE BUSINESS FAILED TO EXERCISE REASONABLE CARE IN ADDRESSING THE HAZARD. THIS COULD INCLUDE EVIDENCE DEMONSTRATING A LACK OF REGULAR INSPECTIONS, INADEQUATE MAINTENANCE, OR AN UNREASONABLE DELAY IN REPAIRING THE POT HOLE AFTER BECOMING AWARE OF IT.

THE "REASONABLE PERSON" STANDARD

COURTS USE THE "REASONABLE PERSON" STANDARD TO DETERMINE NEGLIGENCE. WOULD A REASONABLY PRUDENT PROPERTY OWNER HAVE TAKEN STEPS TO ADDRESS THE POT HOLE GIVEN ITS SIZE, LOCATION, AND POTENTIAL DANGER? THIS IS A KEY ASPECT YOUR LAWYER WILL FOCUS ON DURING THE LEGAL PROCESS.

III. TYPES OF DAMAGES: WHAT YOU CAN CLAIM

COMPENSATORY DAMAGES: RECOVERING YOUR LOSSES

IF YOU SUCCESSFULLY SUE, YOU CAN RECOVER COMPENSATORY DAMAGES TO COVER YOUR ACTUAL LOSSES. THIS TYPICALLY INCLUDES MEDICAL EXPENSES (DOCTOR'S BILLS, THERAPY, MEDICATION), VEHICLE REPAIR COSTS, AND LOST WAGES IF YOUR INJURIES PREVENTED YOU FROM WORKING.

PAIN AND SUFFERING: NON-ECONOMIC DAMAGES

BEYOND FINANCIAL LOSSES, YOU MIGHT BE ENTITLED TO COMPENSATION FOR PAIN AND SUFFERING, EMOTIONAL DISTRESS, AND ANY LASTING PHYSICAL LIMITATIONS CAUSED BY THE ACCIDENT. THESE ARE HARDER TO QUANTIFY BUT ARE OFTEN A SIGNIFICANT PART OF SUCCESSFUL CLAIMS.

PUNITIVE DAMAGES: RARE BUT POSSIBLE

IN CASES OF GROSS NEGLIGENCE OR RECKLESS DISREGARD FOR SAFETY, PUNITIVE DAMAGES MIGHT BE AWARDED. THESE ARE INTENDED TO PUNISH THE BUSINESS AND DETER SIMILAR BEHAVIOR IN THE FUTURE. PUNITIVE DAMAGES ARE LESS COMMON BUT POSSIBLE IN PARTICULARLY EGREGIOUS SITUATIONS.

IV. GATHERING EVIDENCE: BUILDING A STRONG CASE

PHOTOGRAPHING THE SCENE: CRUCIAL EVIDENCE

TAKE CLEAR PHOTOS OF THE POT HOLE, NOTING ITS SIZE, DEPTH, AND LOCATION. PHOTOGRAPHS SHOWING YOUR INJURIES AND THE DAMAGE TO YOUR VEHICLE ARE ALSO ESSENTIAL PIECES OF EVIDENCE. TIME-STAMPED PHOTOS ARE PARTICULARLY VALUABLE.

WITNESS TESTIMONY: CORROBORATING YOUR ACCOUNT

IF THERE WERE WITNESSES TO THE ACCIDENT, OBTAIN THEIR CONTACT INFORMATION AND STATEMENTS. THEIR ACCOUNTS CAN STRENGTHEN YOUR CASE AND PROVIDE INDEPENDENT VERIFICATION OF THE EVENTS.

MEDICAL RECORDS: DOCUMENTING YOUR INJURIES

GATHER ALL RELEVANT MEDICAL RECORDS, INCLUDING DOCTOR'S NOTES, DIAGNOSES, AND TREATMENT PLANS. THESE DOCUMENTS DIRECTLY LINK YOUR INJURIES TO THE POTHOLE ACCIDENT.

POLICE REPORTS: OFFICIAL DOCUMENTATION

IF YOU REPORTED THE ACCIDENT TO THE POLICE, OBTAIN A COPY OF THE POLICE REPORT. THIS PROVIDES AN OFFICIAL RECORD OF THE INCIDENT.

V. LEGAL PROCESS: PURSUING YOUR CLAIM

CONSULT WITH A LAWYER: ESSENTIAL FIRST STEP
