1. GENERATING INITIAL CODES:

AFTER FAMILIARIZING YOURSELF WITH THE DATA, YOU BEGIN TO GENERATE INITIAL CODES. CODES ARE SHORT LABELS OR PHRASES THAT REPRESENT KEY IDEAS, CONCEPTS, OR PATTERNS WITHIN THE DATA. THIS IS AN INDUCTIVE PROCESS; YOU LET THE DATA GUIDE YOU. DON'T OVERTHINK THIS STAGE; AIM FOR A RELATIVELY LARGE NUMBER OF CODES THAT CAPTURE THE ESSENCE OF THE DATA SEGMENTS.

1. SEARCHING FOR THEMES:

THIS CRUCIAL PHASE INVOLVES EXAMINING THE GENERATED CODES AND IDENTIFYING POTENTIAL THEMES. THEMES ARE MORE OVERARCHING AND INTERPRETIVE THAN CODES. THEY REPRESENT RECURRING PATTERNS OR IDEAS THAT APPEAR ACROSS MULTIPLE DATA SEGMENTS. THEMES SHOULD BE WELL-DEFINED, COHERENT, AND INSIGHTFUL, CAPTURING SIGNIFICANT ASPECTS OF THE DATA. THIS OFTEN INVOLVES GROUPING SIMILAR CODES TOGETHER AND REFINING THEIR DEFINITIONS.

1. REVIEWING THEMES:

THIS PHASE INVOLVES CRITICALLY REVIEWING THE IDENTIFIED THEMES. THIS INVOLVES CHECKING FOR COHERENCE, CLARITY, AND ENSURING THAT THE THEMES ACCURATELY REPRESENT THE DATA.
