1. THE CORE, PERIPHERY, AND SEMI-PERIPHERY:

THE CORE: THIS COMPRISES THE ECONOMICALLY DOMINANT NATIONS, POSSESSING ADVANCED TECHNOLOGY, DIVERSIFIED ECONOMIES, AND STRONG POLITICAL INSTITUTIONS. THEY CONTROL GLOBAL FINANCE, TECHNOLOGY, AND PRODUCTION, EXTRACTING RESOURCES AND SURPLUS VALUE FROM OTHER REGIONS. EXAMPLES INCLUDE THE UNITED STATES, WESTERN EUROPEAN COUNTRIES, AND JAPAN.

THE PERIPHERY: THESE ARE TYPICALLY LESS DEVELOPED NATIONS, CHARACTERIZED BY DEPENDENCE ON THE CORE FOR CAPITAL, TECHNOLOGY, AND MARKETS. THEY OFTEN SPECIALIZE IN THE EXTRACTION OF RAW MATERIALS OR LOW-VALUE-ADDED MANUFACTURING, EXPERIENCING PERSISTENT POVERTY AND INEQUALITY. MANY COUNTRIES IN SUB-SAHARAN AFRICA AND PARTS OF LATIN AMERICA FALL INTO THIS CATEGORY.

THE SEMI-PERIPHERY: THIS INTERMEDIATE ZONE CONTAINS NATIONS THAT EXHIBIT CHARACTERISTICS OF BOTH THE CORE AND THE PERIPHERY. THEY MAY HAVE SOME INDUSTRIAL CAPACITY AND DIVERSIFIED ECONOMIES, BUT ARE STILL SUBJECT TO SIGNIFICANT EXPLOITATION BY CORE NATIONS. COUNTRIES LIKE BRAZIL, INDIA, AND MEXICO ARE OFTEN CONSIDERED SEMI-PERIPHERAL.

1. HISTORICAL DEVELOPMENT OF WORLD-SYSTEMS ANALYSIS:

THE ROOTS OF WSA CAN BE TRACED BACK TO THE WORKS OF SCHOLARS LIKE IMMANUEL WALLERSTEIN, WHO IS WIDELY CONSIDERED THE FOUNDER OF MODERN WSA. HIS SEMINAL WORK, *THE MODERN WORLD-SYSTEM I: CAPITALIST AGRICULTURE AND THE ORIGINS OF THE EUROPEAN WORLD-ECONOMY* (1974), LAID THE GROUNDWORK FOR UNDERSTANDING THE HISTORICAL

EVOLUTION OF THE GLOBAL CAPITALIST SYSTEM FROM ITS ORIGINS IN THE LATE 15TH CENTURY. WSA EMPHASIZES THE LONG-TERM HISTORICAL PROCESSES THAT HAVE SHAPED GLOBAL INEQUALITIES, REJECTING THE NOTION OF SEPARATE, INDEPENDENT NATIONAL DEVELOPMENTS.

1. KEY CONCEPTS IN WORLD-SYSTEMS ANALYSIS:

HEGEMONY: THIS REFERS TO THE DOMINANCE OF A SINGLE CORE POWER THAT SHAPES THE RULES AND NORMS OF THE GLOBAL CAPITALIST SYSTEM. HISTORICALLY, DIFFERENT NATIONS HAVE HELD HEGEMONIC POSITIONS, SUCH AS THE NETHERLANDS IN THE 17TH CENTURY AND THE UNITED STATES IN THE 20TH CENTURY.

1. CRITICISMS OF WORLD-SYSTEMS ANALYSIS:

WHILE INFLUENTIAL, WSA HAS FACED CRITICISM. SOME ARGUE THAT ITS FOCUS ON THE MACRO-LEVEL OBSCURES THE AGENCY OF INDIVIDUAL STATES AND ACTORS. OTHERS CONTEND THAT ITS CATEGORIZATION OF NATIONS INTO CORE, PERIPHERY, AND SEMI-PERIPHERY IS OVERLY SIMPLISTIC AND DOESN'T FULLY ACCOUNT FOR THE DIVERSITY WITHIN THESE REGIONS. FURTHERMORE, SOME ARGUE THAT WSA UNDERESTIMATES THE ROLE OF TECHNOLOGICAL INNOVATION AND DOMESTIC POLICIES IN ECONOMIC DEVELOPMENT.
