Section 2: Medium Logical Math Questions with Answers

Question 5: A bat and a ball cost \$1.10 in total. The bat costs \$1.00 more than the ball. How much does the ball cost?

Answer 5: Many people guess \$0.10, but that's incorrect. Let's say the ball costs 'x' dollars. The bat costs $x + \$1.00$. Therefore, $x + (x + \$1.00) = \1.10 . Solving for x, we get $2x = \$0.10$, so $x = \$0.05$. The ball costs \$0.05.

Question 6: A snail is at the bottom of a 10-foot well. Each day it climbs up 3 feet, but slides down 2 feet at night. How many days will it take the snail to reach the top of the well?

Answer 6: On the first day the snail is at 1 foot. On day 2, 2 feet, day 3, 3 feet, day 4, 4 feet, day 5, 5 feet, day 6, 6 feet, day 7, 7 feet. On day 8, the snail climbs to 10 feet, escaping the well. So the answer is 8 days.

Section 3: Hard Logical Math Questions with Answers

Question 7: Two fathers and two sons sat down to eat eggs for breakfast. They ate exactly three eggs, each person eating one egg. How is this possible?

Question 8: You have 12 coins, one of which is counterfeit and weighs slightly more or less than the others. Using a balance scale, what's the minimum number of weighings required to find the counterfeit coin?

Question 9: A farmer needs to transport a fox, a chicken, and a bag of grain across a river using a small boat. The boat can only carry the farmer and one other item at a time. The fox will eat the chicken if left alone, and the chicken will eat the grain if left alone. How can the farmer safely transport all three across the river?

Answer 9: 1. Take the chicken across. 2. Return alone. 3. Take the grain across. 4. Bring the chicken back. 5. Take the fox across. 6. Return alone. 7. Take the chicken across.
