THIS JUXTAPOSITION HIGHLIGHTS THE STARK INEQUALITIES INHERENT IN THE APARTHEID SYSTEM AND HOW IT SHAPES INDIVIDUAL EXPERIENCES AND PERCEPTIONS. THE IRONY IS PALPABLE: THE GUN INTENDED TO PROTECT THEM ULTIMATELY BECOMES A SOURCE OF GREATER ANXIETY AND POTENTIAL DANGER.

EXPLORING THE THEMES OF VIOLENCE AND ITS CONSEQUENCES
