1. CAN I WASH FUR AT HOME? GENERALLY, NO. WASHING FUR AT HOME IS STRONGLY DISCOURAGED. ALWAYS OPT FOR PROFESSIONAL CLEANING TO PREVENT DAMAGE TO THE FUR AND MAINTAIN ITS QUALITY.
